SPEAKER NOTES FROM LAST WEEK:

Veterinary, Dr. Mark Mathusa – Beachside Animal Clinic, Sanibel. Mark and his family moved here a couple of years ago, after Mark sold his veterinary practice on the East Coast of Florida and opened a Coastal Veterinary House Call practice and more recently opened the Beachside Animal Clinic on Sanibel. Mark's animal clinic here will mostly deal with small animals but while on the East Coast of Florida he had experience working with Marineland, Gatorland Zoo, SeaWorld, The Dolphin Research Group and a number of other well-known tourist attraction operations. Although he didn't go into great details about these adventures, he did bring along a slide show of some of his patients through the years. A potbelly pig, that he called intelligent, charming, and fascinating – sounds like love to me. A Sharpie dog, I think he called a four-legged money pit. A dolphin at SeaWorld with a bent dorsal fin ...he said that this was common to dolphins in captivity. He had slides showing a caesarian- section being performed on an Iguana, a domestic cat with a severe eye infection...not a pretty sight, a squirrel being neutered and many more day-in-the-life of a veterinarian pictures. It all goes to prove that animals are just like people...they need a doctor from time to time. Dr. Mathusa also pointed out that although wild animals are extremely cute, they sometimes are carriers of disease examples: raccoons carry worm larvae that can cause brain damage in children; rabies, of course, from raccoons, skunks, and bats; and just recently the wild monkeys spotted on the Island can carry Herpes Virus Infection (B).
