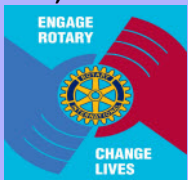

SPEAKER NOTES FROM LAST WEEK:



Dr. Heather Barron, Hospital Director at CROW (Clinic for Rehabilitation of Wildlife). Some of us remember the modest beginnings of CROW in 1968 but with the dedication and commitment of staff and volunteers this organization now cares for as many as 4,000 wildlife patients a year.

Dr. Barron has a wonderful way of connecting with her audience and if that is an indication of how she handles her responsibilities at CROW, we should all step back and pay attention to an organization that is now taking their original mission of "Saving Wildlife Through Care, Education, and Collaboration" and expanding on that to include an interdisciplinary approach to study the relationship between ecological, human, and animal health. Heather described this approach as a "One World, One Health Concept"– connecting the study of human health, animal health, and environment health – conservation medicine.


Heather uses a self-deprecating humorous approach to getting her audience's attention. Her self-described life story is titled "My Life on the D-List, 20 years of "special species" medicine". Dr. Barron certainly has a number of impressive credentials connected with her experience in the special species veterinary field but as she pointed out, this was not exactly the most popular or lucrative branch of veterinary practice to go into back when she got into the field. She knows that some people have the opinion that CROW is some crazy wildlife group version of the crazy cat-lovers club or they are not-so-secret bunny-huggers society but even with some small grain of truth to that, their mission goes above and beyond. CROW's veterinary hospital provides many opportunities for research and study of the environmental impact on our wildlife and that study can bring forth important information connecting this impact on human health. CROW works with a number of scientists and doctors at local, state, and national institutions to improve the understanding of inter-related problems.

One of the examples Dr. Barron spoke of was the connection between West Nile Virus and Avian Influenza. She stated that Global Warming is bringing about atmospheric conditions that allow mosquitoes to go higher into the atmosphere and connect with birds. West Nile virus is transmitted to birds through the bite of infected mosquitoes. Some birds that are predators (such as hawks and owls) or scavengers (such as crows) may become infected after eating sick or dead birds that were already infected with West Nile virus. Mosquitoes become infected by biting infected birds. Mosquitoes infect and transmit West Nile to people. With 4,000 wildlife patients a year, CROW is given a frontline opportunity to not only care for injured and sick wildlife, but to gather information regarding cause and effect of disease carried by these animals.

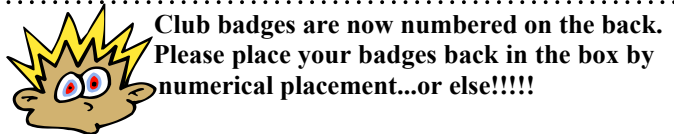
