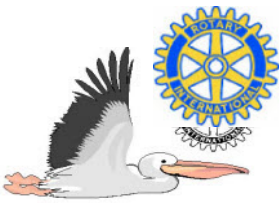

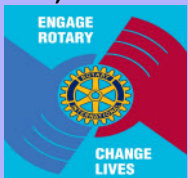

TRAILWAYS CAMPS.

Recently as I was watching the Emmy Awards...one of recipients used a quote in his acceptance speech... **"Make it matter, make it count"**. There are a couple of sources connected to this quote; the most current is Steve Jobs of Apple fame but reaching further back we can go to the Bible, I Corinthians 15:57-58. Either way the words ring true; the lesson here is... go for it, make the moves, make things happen, and make it count for something.



Islanders, Sharon and Jerry Miller, do exactly that. They are the founders of Trailways Camps SWFL - week-long camping experiences which serve adults with special needs, developmental challenges, and the needs of their amazing caregivers.

The camps provide an atmosphere within a safe environment where participants can develop social and recreational skills, build relationships with their peers and have positive life experiences all while having FUN and building self-worth. The camps are primarily funded by the Robert V. and Benjamin G. Miller Fund (named after two of their sons) with some additional fundraising and donations. Supporting partners here in Florida are the Southwest Florida Community Foundation with Goodwill Industries overseeing the management and staffing of the weekly camps. Many medical professionals and volunteers with a variety of talents donate their time and give their loving spirit to these remarkable campers.

The Millers are an outstanding couple, Sharon a licensed clinical social worker, Jerry, and economist, were like most of us a regular married couple, but as the events in their lives unfolded, two of their four children were born with special needs. As these parents soon found out, the majority of help for persons with special needs focuses primarily on the early development years but have very little provisions beyond school age. Before moving to Sanibel, the Millers lived in Austin, Texas and upon investigating the subject of learning environments designed for special need adults there, they came up with a shocking statistic; there were none in and around their community. They brought an advisor team together and in 2005 began a pilot program of holding two week-long-camp sessions filled with a variety of fun and confidence building opportunities for this adult population and respite programs for their caregivers. The pilot program was a success and with the support of the Austin Community Foundation grew into a program running nine-four day camp sessions between 2010/12. Soon after moving to Sanibel, the Millers were curious as to what types of programs were available here in Southwest, FL. serving this same population; the answer "none". Although now aging themselves, the Millers decided to present the Trailways Camp model again, right here in Southwest, FL. In 2012 a Florida site partner was selected (Riverside Retreat Center in Alva), a SWFL

Florida Advisory Group was established, and an organization provider search concluded with Good Will Industries of SWFL selected as the provider of choice. Support was then added by the Southwest Community Foundation. The first Trailways Camp in Florida took place October 22-25, 2012. This year there will be four Trailways Camping weeks...two in central Texas and two in SW Florida with additional weeks being planned for next year. Robert V. and Benjamin G. Miller Fund -A Legacy Fund was created at the Eau Claire Community Foundation to secure the future of the Trailways Camps. People like the Millers exemplify **"Make it Matter, Make it Count"**.
