

Each of these surgeries had cost between \$5,000 to \$10,000, even with doctors and other medical professionals donating their time and talent. Although this program was highly successful, it was evident that the cost of these life-saving surgeries and money spent to bring these children and their families to the United States could be better used if facilities and medical training for doctors and other medical professionals were available closer to areas in need where more children could be helped through *Gift of Life*. Rotary District 6960 assisted 600 children in the last year and a half.

ROTARY TRUST BOARD SUMMMARY REPORT SEPTEMBER

September 16, 2015

September meeting started with roughly \$67,000 available for Grants ended after roughly \$17,000 was granted to support groups we have previously supported: Shell Museum; Dubin (Alzheimer Support) Center; Nola Theiss's Group fighting Human Trafficking; CROW; El Hogar (scholarships for impoverished children in Honduras); Clinica Verde (healthcare for poor in Nicaragua); Gift of Life (funding heart screening and surgery in Haiti)

The Procedure committee continues to work on ways to improve communication with members and procedures for Grants, this meeting summary is one of those ideas.

The Sanibel-Captiva RotaryTrust (reprint from sanibelrotary.com)

The Trust is independent from the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club. Funds raised by the Club are donated to the Trust Fund. All charitable grants are then reviewed and decided upon by the Trust's Board of Directors. Representing the interests of the Club's members, the Trust Board prefers to make grants to fund specific projects or events that will help an organization achieve its mission.

Grants are not limited to tax-exempt 501 (c) (3) organizations. Typically, individual grants range from \$250 to \$2,500. Applicants will be well regarded if they can demonstrate that their grant:

Makes a substantial difference in the quality of their community's life Facilitates collaboration and help builds partnerships between organizations, local government, or public institutions to create positive change

Helps build their capacity to become more effective in their community. The Club also prefers to Fund organizations that are focused on:

Education

Health care, particularly for children

Helping families

Providing clean water to needy communities

Applying for a Grant

All Grant requests can ONLY be submitted by a Club Member-Sponsor. Grants are reviewed regularly by the *Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Trust Board*. Typically, it takes between 60 and 90 days to review and process a grant request. Written notification of the Club's decision will occur shortly after the grant decision is made. If you are not sure whether you know a member or not, please join us at one of the Club's breakfast meetings. If you don't know any members and still think the Club will be interested in helping your organization, please contact the Chairman of the Club's Trust Board by using the "Contact" Form on this website.

The Member-Sponsor can provide details on the requirements, and the process for obtaining a grant.

What We Expect

If you are awarded a grant, a Progress Report must be provided within 6 months of funding describing how the funds were used and if the desired outcomes were achieved. If you do not submit the Progress Report your organization will not be considered for any new Grants.

The Club also expects the recipient to maximize publicity for the support provided by Rotary.
